> LOCAL CRIMES AND FRAUD AFFECT **BANK ACCOUNTS**

From Hutchinson Police Chief Dan Hatten, "We are seeing an increase in fraud and crime tied to people's finances and we want to remind residents to be alert for these types of activities."

- You receive a check and letter in the mail stating that you are selected to be a CONSUMER RESEARCH PROGRAMMER OR **MYSTERY SHOPPER**. The check you receive is usually for a few thousand dollars. You are instructed to cash the check, keeping a couple hundred dollars to do some shopping as per their instructions, also keeping a few hundred dollars as your fee. The balance of the money is to be sent back to the originator in the form of a money-gram. In the end, the original check you receive is fraudulent. You will be required to pay the money back for that check.
- You receive a check in the mail for a few thousand dollars as part of **WINNING A** LOTTERY. (In most instances, it is a Canadian Lottery.) You are to cash the check or deposit into your own account and then send the money back to the lottery company to cover your taxes and other expenses. They promise to then send you a very large check for your winnings. Again, this original check is fraudulent and the consumer is required to pay for the money that is lost.
- You receive a letter or e-mail to notify you of a **HIGH-RETURN INVESTMENT** that is available to only a few selected people and you must respond by sending them money immediately. The investment is bogus and you are out the money you send them.
- You receive a call from someone who CLAIMS TO WORK AT YOUR BANK. You are informed that the bank is completing a computer upgrade so they will need to ask you some personal questions including account numbers and social security number. This information is then used to access your accounts through various fraudulent ways.
- Stealing someone's purse and taking blank checks, credit cards and getting other personal information is very common. Thieves will break into a vehicle to get a purse that is visible. Do not leave purses, wallets or check books in your car or at least make sure that they are not visible.

Many of the above mentioned crimes are committed against elderly people. Please make sure you check your bank account on a monthly basis to see if any unusual activity has taken place.
